There is no such thing as a "safe" rat poison. Scientific studies have found anticoagulant rat poisons in a variety of animals.




NO RAT POISON



Rat poisons not only kill rats but also the wildlife around them, including coyotes, foxes, raccoons, hawks and even pet dogs and cats.



RODENT PROOF YOUR HOME

- Keep trash bins tightly closed and clean 
- Seal cracks and openings into your home 
- Trim trees close to your house 
- **Never** use glue traps
- Attract owls with a nest box - Owls are great for pest control!
